



School Development Plan Current Academic Year - 2020-21

Context: Following the pandemic and the full reopening of schools from 8th March 2021, the development plan has been updated to address the gaps in knowledge and skills that may now be present for many of our children, particularly those who are disadvantaged, through the strategic use of 'catch-up' funding. It also builds on new learning that occurred during the period of lockdown when the school moved to teaching online.

Wider school development, particularly around the quality of education including the quality of teaching and outcomes for children, will be the focus as children return full time to the classroom and the wider curriculum offer.

Quality of Education for Progress and Outcomes

- *To ensure teachers use what they know pupils can do or understand to plan activities that meet the needs of all pupils from their different starting points in all subjects
- To further develop the teaching of reading through the school to enable all children to become fluent and confident and demonstrate enjoyment in reading
- *To ensure consistency in the teaching of writing ensuring that children have the skills to be confident and fluent writers across the curriculum
- *To continue to provide regular opportunities for children to develop their reasoning and fluency skills in mathematics and apply across the curriculum where appropriate
- To further develop the curriculum so learning experiences build coherently to develop skills and knowledge and are matched to pupil needs taking into account the local context to create meaningful, inclusive experiences
- **To strengthen links between the in class support and the additional interventions in place for those pupils with SEND
